WHAT WE DO

Teen Challenge of the Dakotas offers a residential program for adult males, 18 years and older. The 14-month program consists of five phases: 8 months of induction and training (the first four phases) and 6 months of re-entry (the fifth and final phase), which is focused on discipleship and assistance in transitioning back into the “real world.”

WHAT MAKES US UNIQUE

The real heart of our program is that we focus on the man as a whole, rather than look at the dysfunction, whether it's addiction, depression, criminal activity or something else. Instead, we reach into a man's heart, which is where all the issues of life flow from (Proverbs 4:23). Rather than teaching a man what *not* to do, we lead him into a new freedom, helping him find purpose, vision and hope for the future.
